




















Tonal Drawings

Impressive pencil sketching by Year 7

During their first Art and Design lesson at The Hinckley School, 7 Birmingham were asked to produce a timed drawing of a bird as a baseline activity. All students were asked to demonstrate progress from their starting point, regardless of their ability. Throughout a series of lessons, students were introduced to technical drawing processes such as using basic shapes, guidelines and grids to accurately sketch their subject matter. before moving on to the application of tone and mark making to enhance 3D form. This practice was implemented in their first Art Assessment in which they were challenged to produce a tonal drawing of their chosen animal. It is evident that all students strived to improve from their starting point and have responded proactively to feedback in order to produce some high-quality outcomes. A special mention goes out to Henne who has produced an expert level submission which has captured such fine details and markings within the bird's feathers and wings, exceeding the expected level of a Year 7 student.

Breast Cancer Awareness

CoppaFeel! Awareness Lessons

As part of our commitment to supporting student well-being and health education, we will be running Breast Cancer Awareness lessons with students.

It will be delivered by their teacher using resources provided by CoppaFeel! who are the UK's first breast cancer awareness charity.

Although breast cancer is a serious topic, CoppaFeel! approaches it in an age-appropriate way. They aim to encourage young people to check monthly, educate them to know the signs of breast cancer and empower them to contact their GP if they notice any unusual changes to their chest. When breast cancer is diagnosed early, treatments are more effective and survival rates are higher.

We hope these lessons encourage students to be attuned to their own bodies and helps to break the

stigma around this topic and chest-checking.

In addition to our awareness sessions, on **Friday 17th October**, we will be holding a **'Wear it Pink Day'** where students will be able to wear a pink adornment (shoe laces, earrings, headband, gloves, socks etc) alongside their normal uniform for the **suggested donation of £1** - available on Parent Pay. There will also be a bake sale, games and quizzes for students to get involved with during lunchtime; these fundraising activities will be cash only.

Attendance Matters

Our Journey

This time last year, our attendance figures told a story we were determined to change. Too many students were missing out on valuable learning, and the effect could be seen in outcomes, confidence, and culture.

Since then, we have placed 'Attendance Matters!' at the heart of our work. Over the last twelve months we have:

- •Introduced daily first-period calls so every absence is followed up immediately.
- •Ensured pastoral leaders and tutors speak directly with any student whose attendance falls below 93%.
- •Launched Attendance Improvement Meetings (AIMs) to support families and break down barriers for our most vulnerable students.
- •Developed a range of celebrations and rewards, from postcards home to certificates, raffles, and the popular attendance wheels.

The impact has been clear: our attendance has improved significantly compared with the same point last year. This represents thousands of additional lessons attended and a stronger sense of belonging across the school. It is proof that when we all work together, attendance really does make a difference.

Why Attendance Matters!

Attendance is not just a number on a register — it is the foundation for achievement and wellbeing.

- •Academically: Students with high attendance achieve better grades. Missing just one day a fortnight adds up to weeks of lost learning.
- •Socially: Regular attendance helps students maintain

friendships and feel part of their tutor group and year team

•For the future: Employers and colleges look at attendance as a sign of reliability and commitment.

That is why we say again and again: 'Attendance Matters!' It is the golden thread that links belonging, learning, and opportunity.

Launching Attendance Ambassadors

This term, we are proud to launch an exciting new initiative: Attendance Ambassadors. This programme brings students into the centre of our strategy, because who better to promote attendance than the young people it affects most?

What Will Ambassadors Do?

- •Mentor peers: Support classmates whose attendance has dipped, offering encouragement and practical advice.
- •Promote campaigns: Share attendance messages in assemblies, create posters, and contribute ideas to tutor time activities.
- •Co-design rewards: Help staff develop prizes and celebrations that feel meaningful for students.
- •Celebrate success: Take a leading role in recognition during assemblies.

Students will be receiving information about the initiative this coming week where we will be opening applications for students to apply.

I encourage parents and carers to discuss attendance at home with students and to think carefully if they would like to take on a position of leadership in becoming an attendance ambassador.
