Today's session was titled 'Consultation and Engaging with Site' and saw students introduced to field-work, as they used clay to capture unique textures and intersections. After just two hours with our Bridge students, Kate shared how 'articulate' and 'forthcoming' the group were and how much she was looking forward to working closely with them all.

Their next session is titled 'Patterns and Problem Solving on the Production Line' and we can't wait to see what our talented artists create!

Bali will be signing books and meeting students throughout the day.








Writing workshop -20 spaces


