Our Year 11 Basketball Team took part in the County Cup Basketball Tournament at Bosworth Academy on Thursday 20th November.




#### £5.9k Grants Secured

#### Cooking Up a Storm!

Our Year 10 & 11 Hospitality & Catering students have been practising the complex preparation, cooking and presentation skills needed for the requirements of 'Unit 2: Hospitality & catering in Action'. Students were fully engaged in the lesson, making BBQ chicken wings, seasoned potato wedges and homemade coleslaw. All produced in under 2 hours - with fabulous results!



#### **Line Drawings**

After completing tonal animal drawings, Year 7 Fine Art students reflected on the strengths and limitations of shading with pencil before moving on to controlled studies using ballpoint pen. This is a demanding technique, but 7 Oxford have shown real resilience in their sampling—experimenting confidently with colour palettes and combinations. Their emerging highland cow studies demonstrate fantastic attention to the direction and length of each line, as well as careful preservation of white highlights to capture the glossy texture of the fur. We can't wait to see their final outcomes!











#### **DSLR Photography**

Year 9 Fine Art students explored DSLR photography this week, learning key exposure, composition and lighting techniques. They staged objects connected to their chosen public figure or celebrity, using visual components to communicate identity and meaning. After reviewing their initial shots, students completed a followup shoot and some experimented with digital editing to further refine their work. This project offered an exciting introduction to the endorsement areas available at GCSE Art, Craft & Design at The Hinckley School. In the coming weeks, students will begin translating their photographs into fine art outcomes, informed by their observations and sampling.
