
Thank you to parents and carers for helping students to maintain high standards in their uniform during our current hot weather, as the forecast suggests, this will continue until the end of the school

Ben Davis Inspired Budding Authors



The Hinckley School was thrilled to welcome author Ben Davis for a special visit that left a lasting impression on students and staff alike. Author of funny books for older children and teenagers including the Joe Cowley series, My Embarrassing Dad's Gone Viral and Make Me Awesome, Ben has been praised for accurately representing the awkwardness of adolescence with funny and moving stories.

During his time with us, Ben delivered an engaging talk about his journey as a writer, sharing valuable insights into the world of publishing, creativity, and storytelling.

Following the talk, smaller groups of students had the unique opportunity to take part in hands-on writing workshops led by Ben himself. These interactive sessions, which took place in the Library, encouraged our budding authors to explore their own voices, develop new ideas, and gain confidence in their writing abilities.

The visit was part of our ongoing commitment to promoting reading for pleasure and fostering a love for writing among students. We are incredibly grateful to Ben Davis for taking the time to inspire the next generation of storytellers.

World of Work - Alumni Assembly

This week, we welcomed former student, Hannah McReynolds, as part of the World of Work offer for Year 10. Hannah spoke to students about her career pathway and the twists and turns which saw her arrive where she is today.

Hannah started off as a carer, before returning to education in her early 20's in an Access to Nursing course, developing strategies to help her Dyslexia along the way. Hannah went on to gain a first in her nursing Degree. She has since completed two Masters and a Diploma in Tropical Nursing. Students heard about how Hannah took a "sabbatical" from her job as an ED nurse at Leicester Royal Infirmary to work in an Ebola Treatment Center in Seirra Leone, working in incredibly difficult circumstances nursing children and adults from the community with Ebola, in incredible heat. Hannah stayed on in Sierra Leone to support other nurses in setting up systems around infection prevention control in the other hospitals in Freetown. Hannah received a medal from the late Queen for her services to West Africa.






REDMOOR GET A TASTE OF OUR SIXTH FORM EXPERIENCE

So You Want to Be a Doctor? - Leicester University







Mr Tallis and Mrs Sturgess took fifteen Year 9 students to an event at Leicester University to gain an understanding of the training and career pathways students might take across a career in medicine. The students were able to talk to and ask questions with the student ambassadors, Fatimah a final year medicine student and Natalie, a first year medicine student.

The day started with a talk from local GP and GP Trainer, Dr Sam Adcock who talked about overcoming difficulties to pursue his education in medicine and what being a GP means.

The first workshop was an opportunity for students to learn about finding out a patient's history and techniques used. Watching Junior Doctors first, they were able to work out what illness the patient had come to the GP through open questioning techniques and find out their individual medical and lifestyle history – it was an appendicitis!

In the second session, students had the opportunity to learn about triaging, being given a number of different patients with a variety of needs working out what the issues could be and which patient they should see as a priority.

After lunch the students had an opportunity to have a tour of the campus, they were able to go to the communal and social areas of the University and visit the library which houses 1.3 million books. They also saw the house where the Attenborough children were brought up.

The students were engaged in the activities and were great ambassadors for The Hinckley School. By the end of the day, we had a few more students contemplating a career in medicine.


