Students will now be asked to consider how to reuse/recycle plastic-based synthetic materials in their future designs and look to take further inspiration from the incredibly popular 'Jellycat' soft toys.

Miss Webster, Miss Jones and Ms Beale worked with any Year 7 students who remained in school, using clay relief techniques to produce a seascape 'tile design' inspired by a print that included crashing waves and giant emerging octopus tentacles. Students utilised a variety of tools and moulds to help recreate the scene.

## Sixth Form Safety Event

### Supporting safe milestones

Our Sixth Form Safety Event took place on Thursday 16th October, with a series of talks, activities and demonstrations taking place throughout the day. This important annual event supports our students to keep themselves and others safe as they reach key milestones, such as passing their driving test and turning 18.

Students listened to a powerful talk about driver and passenger safety and visited fair stalls where they took part in VR simulations, tried out mock 'beergoggles' and created mock-tails, as well as discussing personal safety, consent and fire safety. Students really engaged with our visitors from Leicestershire Police Service, Leicestershire Fire & Rescue Service and Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council and approached the sometimes hard-hitting topics with real maturity.

In the last session of the day,
Leicestershire Fire and Rescue Service
staged a demonstration to show how
they would rescue a casualty following
a road traffic collision. This powerful
demonstration really brought into
focus the messages throughout the
event and highlighted once again to
our students the importance of making
safe, well-considered choices.

### What Are T Levels?

Last academic year we sent out a survey to parents and carers about the careers offer at The Hinckley School. While 41% of respondents reported being extremely familiar with the A Level pathway, only 10% indicated they were somewhat familiar with T Levels.

T Levels are two-year technical qualifications for students aged 16-19, designed as an alternative to A Levels and apprenticeships. They combine:

- Classroom learning (80%) focused on core knowledge and occupational specialisms.
- Industry placements (20%) around 45 days in a real work environment.

Each T Level is equivalent to three A Levels and is developed in collaboration with employers to ensure students gain the skills needed for the workplace. T Levels are ideal for students who want a hands-on learning experience while keeping options open for university, apprenticeships, or employment.
