A high percentage of students yet again applied to stay and continue their seven -year journey by studying at The Hinckley Sixth Form, where they will be joined by young people from many other high schools. Students also secured the grades required to build their brighter futures and to follow their dreams of working in fields related to Medicine, Family Law and Aerospace Engineering.

Eva shared how her nerves turned to pride this morning after learning she had been awarded 9 GCSEs at grades 9-6, "I woke up so scared, my heart was racing but now I am over the moon, I'm so relieved that my hard work has all paid off and I've got the results that I deserved." Eva is excited to build on her impressive grades, which included 9s in English Language, English Literature and History, by studying at The Hinckley Sixth Form, as she follows her dream to have a career in family law. In addition to her incredible hard work and determination, Eva credits her supportive teachers for helping her achieve success and is looking forward to benefiting from her strong working relationship with them over the next two years. "Teachers have been amazing, the most supportive people I could have wished for. The Hinckley Sixth Form's Class of 2025 celebrated with their friends, family and teachers on Thursday as they collected their A Level and BTEC exam results. For many students, this marked the end of their unforgettable seven-year journey, as they congratulated each other on securing their dream destinations.

Students have once again secured the grades they needed to continue to outstanding destinations. The Class of 2025 will be studying degree courses including Law, Natural Sciences and Aerospace Engineering at leading universities across the country, including the University of Cambridge, as well as entering employment and beginning competitive apprenticeships in areas such as project management. Everyone at The Hinckley Sixth Form is incredibly proud of what these inspirational young people have achieved and know that they will continue to build a brighter future for themselves.

Ewan is celebrating today as his incredible four A* grades mean he has secured a place to study Natural Sciences with an integrated Masters at the University of Cambridge; a dream made a reality through his hard work and dedication, and supported by the Sixth Form's bespoke Early Entry Oxbridge Pathway. Ewan credits this with helping him to stand out during the interview process. Thinking of a career in research in the future, Ewan is understandably over the moon with his results and shared how supportive teachers have helped him over the past two years: "Teachers here help to push you, they give you independence, and the space to grow on your own." Looking back on seven-years of unforgettable memories, Elliot, shared how he wished he "could stay here forever" after collecting his impressive results. Securing an A* in Maths and a grade A in both Physics and Chemistry, and now looking to pursue a career in engineering in the future, Elliot reflected on his time in sixth form: "I have enjoyed my time here and it has flown by, I've had really knowledgeable teachers who pushed me to do better. They were great and really cared about my success."

Felix shared, "Having our own mature study spaces has made me feel ready for university style learning."

A student now combining learning alongside employment is Ollie, who has secured an exciting apprenticeship as a Buying Assistant at Mediq within the healthcare sector. Ollie feels ready for the new challenge, and says that the Sixth Form has helped him prepare for the future. Having joined The Hinckley Sixth Form alongside lots of his friends from Hastings High School, Ollie is now graduating as part of the Class of 2025 after a great two years, with unforgettable memories, including playing for the Sixth Form Colts XI Rugby Team, and with lots of new lifelong friends.



GOLD DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD - ASSESSED EXPEDITION







Our Gold Duke of Edinburgh's Award group ventured to the Snowdonia National Park over the summer holidays. They travelled to Wales to take part in what was a four-day personal challenge. Once arriving at Capel Curig, the teams completed an acclimatisation walk around the bottom of Moel Siabod; they then met with their assessor after dinner and enjoyed a relaxing evening of games at The

Woodlands, Betws-y-Coed. The team had pre-planned their route and campsites at our weekly meetings - a vital procedure for a successful expedition.

On Saturday, the team were taken to their starting point at the Canolfan Prysor Centre, Trawsfynydd Lake. From there they walked through the Rhinog mountains, camping at night and motivating themselves to get through their eight hours of planned route and activity.

Tuesday (Day 4) finished at Barmouth Beach, where they enjoyed an ice cream. Our final evening was spent having a BBQ, watching the stars and chilling out in the lovely sunshine. Graham, the Expedition assessor, commented as follows: "The team were fully equipped and well prepared for their venture. They set themselves a challenging route which tested their physical, mental, and emotional stamina. Increasing heat became a particular challenge, which they handled well. They became aware of and accepted the learning opportunities that this experience would provide. I was impressed by the team's maturity in approaching this event. They worked well as a team and developed and understood the importance of their teamwork skills as the expedition progressed. Well done and congratulations."
