UNVEILING OUR BRAND NEW SIXTH FORM 'CAFE6'

This week, we were delighted to unveil our brand new Cafe6 area. Exclusively used by our sixth form students, Cafe6 provides a dining, relaxation and study space for Year 12 and 13 students to enjoy as part of their sixth form experience here at The Hinckley Sixth Form.

The re development of this area focussed on creating a space which emulated the feel of a university dining and study space, with distinct zones. The first part of the new café now allows students to utilise this space more effectively during their study and free periods thanks to nine brand new banquet style tables and three movable collaboration tables with plug and USB power ports, allowing our students to easily utilise laptops and IT facilities as part of their study. Two large flat screen TVs now framed by modern oak look panelling, will also allow the space to be used for seminars and events. Meanwhile, the other side of Cafe6 now features a dining zone, complete with mature coffee shop styling thanks to textured faux boxwood panelling, a neon sign and sofas - giving students the perfect space to catch up with friends and meet with staff.

Student voice was at the heart of this project, with their ideas, such as framed artwork featuring photos of the Hinckley area, all being brought to life in this new design. Feedback from our students so far has been incredible, they have shared how impressed they are with this newly refurbished facility and how amazed they are with how different it not only looks but feels.

We look forward to welcoming many more students and their families to see Cafe6 in person over the coming weeks and months, so that our community can see for themselves the investment we have made in our young people and their sixth form experience.

Oxford University Visit

On Wednesday 6th November twenty-two Year 11 students visited the dreaming spires of Oxford University.

Our Elite Scholars programme aims to encourage students to aspire to be the very best they can be including applying to the world's top-ranking university. Our hosts were Christ Church, one of the largest and, arguably, one of the most beautiful of the Oxford colleges. As part of the programme we will be doing follow up work on what steps students need to take this year and into Sixth Form to make those aspirations a reality.


The day started with a talk by Dr Joel Butler, the college Outreach Officer. He discussed reasons to apply to university and Oxford in particular. This included a very helpful discussion of potential barriers such as finance and the feeling that Oxford is "for other people". With regard to the latter he described his own modest background and how diverse the university now is. We then met undergraduates who answered our students' questions on college life, academic expectations and the work/ life balance.

We were given a tour of the college taking in the magnificent quadrangles, where undergraduates live, and the college cathedral, a feature unique to Christ Church. Undoubtably the highlight for students was lunching in the college hall which doubled as the hall at Hogwarts in the Harry Potter films.


The afternoon was occupied with the simulation of a college seminar. A post graduate research student led the seminar, setting a problem on how computer modelling can be used to track the growth of cancers. This gave us some insight into the challenging and stimulating learning the college provides.

BODYWIZE GYM LESSONS-REPLY SLIP REMINDER

We recently announced a joint partnership between our PE department and BodyWize Gym in Hinckley. This partnership will see all Year 10 PE core students take part in one gym session per fortnight at BodyWize, where students can work independently on their own physical development with expert professionals on hand to support individual training needs.

We would like to remind Year 10 students that without returning their completed reply forms, they will be unable to participate in these gym sessions and encourage students to return their completed reply slips as soon as possible.

This is an incredible provision that BodyWize have made possible for our community and we would like to thank them for partnering with us to support our young people.



ANTARCTICA FLAGS

Before half term, Year 7 and Year 8 students participated in the Antarctica flags competition run by the Geography department. In form time students learnt about Antarctica Day- the 1st December- and were then tasked with designing flags to send to Antarctica as part of a fieldwork project. Antarctica Day marks the signing of the Antarctic Treaty on December 1st 1959, a document declaring that Antarctica would be off limits to military activity and setting it aside as a place for peace and scientific discoveries. The Antarctic Flags Project pairs schools with scientists and support personnel travelling to Antarctica, who carry copies of flags designed by students to fly on the continent, returning photos and certificates to the schools upon the conclusion of their expeditions.

As a department, we have had some excellent submissions from Year 7 and Year 8. We have selected the designs that best represent the Antarctic Treaty and collated the flags to make two submissions. We expect the flags to be returned to us sometime between December and May. Thank you all for your effort and engagement with this competition. Congratulations to our winners!

Dofe Bronze Explores Swithland Woods



CELEBRATING CREATIVITY AND SHARING INSPIRING OPPORTUNITIES

ACRYLIC PAINTING

After learning about colour theory, Year 8 art students started to question whether or not black can be classified as a colour, and if so, whether or not it should be included on the colour wheel. The knowledge of tints (hue + white), tones (hue + grey) and shades (hue + black) was then explored through a series of practical tasks in which students mixed tint and shade bars using acrylic paint, before moving on to applying the theory to berries. Most of the class chose to practice adding tints, tones and shades to the berry using inktense pencils, before moving on to acrylic paint. I'm sure that you will agree, the results are absolutely fantastic, with students recalling their understanding of adding tone to basic shapes from Y7 to support accurate and effective application. A very challenging task and so congratulations to all students in Miss Webster's class. A particular thanks goes to Grayson and Rylie who both came to the front to demonstrate the task to peers using the visualiser!!'


