Students secured the outcomes required to build their brighter futures and to follow their dreams of working in industries including Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, Engineering and International Law.



Teigan is just one of the many students celebrating, after being awarded 9 GCSEs - all at grades 9 and 8! This incredible achievement is a testament to her resilience and hard work and Teigan is now looking forward to following her dream of working in international law by studying Spanish, English Literature and Philosophy. Reflecting on her time at The Hinckley School, Teigan shared memories of the additional opportunities she has enjoyed as a community role model alongside her studies, "I have taken advantage of every volunteering opportunity available during my time here, I have read to Year 7 students and even taken part in litter picks. Students this year have secured the grades they needed to study degree courses including International Relations and Law at leading universities across the country, take up roles within industry including in the education sector, and accept places on competitive apprenticeships with companies such as MIRA. Everyone at The Hinckley Sixth Form is incredibly proud of what these inspirational young people have achieved and know that this is just the beginning of the bright future they have begun to build.

One student who has truly embodied the sixth form's PRIDE values is Sofiia, who left Ukraine in 2022 to come to the UK, joining the sixth form in Year 12. Now graduating as part of the Class of 2024 having achieved an astounding four A*s in Psychology, Sociology, Criminology and Extended Project Qualification, Sofiia can now proudly follow her dreams by studying Politics with International Relations at The University of York. Sofiia has always had an interest in current affairs and international relations, with the conflict in Ukraine and her move to the UK further reinforcing her desire to have her say and to "make an impact on the future by playing a part in helping to develop conversations between countries." Sofiia explained how the sixth form team made her feel supported, settled and at home right from the start, treating her like any other student, but always checking in on her wellbeing. Looking ahead, Sofiia sees her future in the UK and said, "I am very excited for my new chapter and to turn over a new leaf, but I am keen to keep in touch with the team here as I have built really strong and

LATEST NEWS FROM OUR DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD

Congratulations to Harry, who has recently achieved his Gold Duke of Edinburgh's award, he will now be invited to the palace at some point this year.

'Well done on becoming a Gold Award holder Harry, well deserved.' - A very proud DofE team.

Harry volunteered for 12 months with 1st Britannia Beaver colony, supporting them with weekly meetings, badge work and programme planning, as well as giving back to the community.





For his physical section of the award, he continued to play for his local football team. For the skill section, he developed his musical ability through drumming. The residential section of the award involves a 4 night, 5-day experience, Harry chose to attend an adventure week, taking part in coasteering, climbing, ringo rides, paddle sports, tunnelling, target sports and high ropes. He gained much from new experiences and learning new skills with Cumulus in Swanage. This experience involves meeting the other members in the group for the first time, often stepping out of your comfort zone and working together with people you do not know. For his expedition, Harry was part of a team of 6 who took on Snowdonia for their walking adventure, they set themselves a challenging route which tested their physical and mental stamina. They coped with and overcame all the challenges to complete a very successful expedition with Harry making a valuable contribution to the team. Others in his team recognised someone who stayed 'switched on' throughout this event; he was focussed, well organised and showed concern for his teams' welfare. Congratulations Harry!



Gold Assessed Expedition

Our Gold group ventured to the Snowdonia National park over the Summer holidays. On Friday 9th August they travelled to Wales to take part in what was a 4 day personal challenge. Once arriving at Capel Curig, the teams completed an acclimatisation walk around the bottom of Moel Siabod, they then met with their assessor after dinner and enjoyed a relaxing evening of games at The Woodlands, Betws-y-Coed.

The team had pre-planned their route and campsites at our weekly meetings, a vital procedure for a successful expedition.



On Saturday, the team was taken to their starting village of Gellilydan, from there they walked over the Rhinog mountains, camping at night, motivating themselves to get round their 8 hours of planned route and activity. Day 4 finished at Barmouth beach, where they enjoyed an ice cream. Our final evening was spent having a BBQ and avoiding the rain.

Graham, Expedition Assessor commented the following: 'The team were fully equipped and well prepared for their venture. They set themselves a challenging route which tested their physical, mental, and emotional stamina. Increasing heat became a particular challenge, which they handled well. They became aware of and accepted the learning

opportunities that this experience would provide. I was impressed by the team's maturity in approaching this event. They worked well as a team and developed and understood the importance of their teamwork skills as the expedition progressed. Well done and congratulations.
