Unveiling our latest school improvements.



GCSE Success

'After achieving an exceptional set of GCSE results this summer, we couldn't wait to share some of our extremely talented Fine Artists' work with you!

Year 11 Fine Art students spent their spring term responding independently to an externally set starting point (theme) from the exam board, producing a body of investigative and preparatory work that supported the completion of their final piece. Our visiting moderator from the exam board commended the students for their inquisitive nature, challenging themselves to explore and experiment with the application of a broad range of materials and techniques inspired by their artist and designer sources. As you can see from the selection included, they all showed courage in making their own choices, with each individual making very different and personalised selections appropriate to their ideas. The moderator was also impressed with the number of students who were able to 'fuse' effective components together within their outcomes, making purposeful links to all references.

Students concluded their project by sitting a 10-hour assessment in which they worked completely unaided to produce their responses - a hard task for all of us to remain silent for such an extended period! The Art Department and invigilators were impressed with their conduct, demonstrating PRIDE throughout the (at times rather stressful) process.

Well done to all of our students - you did a phenomenal job and made Miss Webster one very proud art teacher.

BIOPSYCHOLOGY

Exploring neurons and the nervous system.

Year 13 has started looking at the biopsychology topic and has had an amazingly enthusiastic start. They've tackled some tricky concepts already, including the specific structures and functions of neurons, as well as the divisions and responsibilities of different parts of the nervous system. This week, they put their learning into practice, explaining the process of synaptic transmission using sweets! They carefully crafted and annotated their 3D diagrams (before too many 'receptors' and 'neurotransmitters' went missing) and it was a great effort from everyone. CRAZY CREATURES


During the six week break, we were excited to welcome our new Year 7 students to our annual Summer School event. As part of this two day event, students were able to visit the Art Department and access the clay and

ceramics facilities. After learning about the advantages and disadvantages of clay, students used this understanding to develop 'Crazy Creature' models constructed from basic thumb pots. Day two saw students focus on how 'character' could be added to their designs through additional features, expression and body language. 
