




#### EXAMINING THE STRUCTURE OF LUNGS

Students in Mr Taylor's class were examining the structure of the lungs this week, investigating how they inflate as well as identifying key structures such as the trachea, bronchi and bronchioles.

Mr Taylor shared the reason behind the lesson, "The purpose of this was to ensure that students were able to relate what they had learnt in theory into what it looks like in real life." Students are now moving onto look at anaerobic respiration and what happens when our respiratory system is unable to acquire enough oxygen to release energy from glucose.

## Mr Lee's London Classics Challenge




"Well that's a wrap – our London Classics 2023 Challenge was completed over the weekend with my wife and I taking part in the 2-mile Swim Serpentine event in Hyde Park (along with the London Marathon in April and the RideLondon-Essex 100-mile bike ride in May). You can claim a London Classics medal by completing all three events at any time – they don't all have to be done in the same year, but we set ourselves the challenge of doing all three in 2023 in memory of our son, who we lost to suicide last October. As part of this, many of you will remember us raising money for <a href="Place2Be">Place2Be</a>, a wonderful children's mental health charity who work in schools up and down the UK. Students and staff at The Hinckley School helped raise an amazing £774.30 out of our final total of £7094.62. It is very hard for me to put into words just how much the support from everyone at the school has meant to us over the last year, but on top of the fundraising, the care and concern of our school community and amazing words of support and encouragement from so many of our students has touched our hearts forever.






