Tins for Trainers Foodbank Collection





Thank you to the foodbank team for their tireless work to support our community, we look forward to supporting this community cause again in the future.



The woodland focuses solely on the conservation of this endangered primate. Each visit contributes to their conservation and protection. Visitors can walk amongst the monkeys and also observe their fascinating natural behaviours from up close! This is the only place in the UK you can do this! Making it one of the most unique days out in the country.	
Burbage Common Cost: No Fee	Burbage Common is Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council's largest countryside site and is located on the edge of Hinckley, within easy reach from both East and West Midlands. Burbage Common features walking routes, picnic spaces and play areas.
