EXCELLENT WORK IN DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

We are proud to share an update regarding the hard work of our Year 9 students in their Design and Technology lessons with Mr Pitchford. Two weeks ago we shared that the class were hard at work producing metal statuettes to celebrate an event and are delighted to share that more students have now completed their figurines with fantastic results, as you can see from the photos on the right.

Students researched the type of figure they wanted to make by collecting images and turning them into stick people, they then marked out metal bars so they knew where to bend and then hammer their figures into shape. The heads were then permanently connected to the body using brazing.

In addition, Year 7 students have also been enjoying their Design and Technology lessons by making an apprentice piece that demonstrates that they know how to use the following tools; rule, tri square, bench hook, saw, pillar drill and the disk sander. The project gives students confidence and skills in using machines and tools in the workshop. Keep up the great work!
