
Ms Key's Top Revision Tips

YEAR 8 STUDENTS ENJOY 'READING EGGS'

Reading Eggs is an online programme enjoyed by students in Year 8 three times a week in the Library. Students read books from the computer programme then answer questions and complete quizzes. After each quiz students gain points they can 'spend' creating characters on the online platform. Designed to improve literacy and reading skills, students involved have seen their reading ages improve by as much as 18 months over a 5 month period.

The fun activities not only help students to improve their literacy, but to also gain a love of reading for pleasure. Year 8 student Gracie shared how the quizzes are her favourite part and that Reading Eggs has helped her reading to progress over the last few months.

Supporting Students Throughout the Exam Period

This week students in Year 11 have been receiving support following their mock exams, from mock paper feedback in subject lessons and recapping key questions and topics to embed understanding, to visits by external speakers and intervention sessions.

We have been extremely proud of the conduct and attitude of our students during this period and our staff are focused on ensuring that we support Year 11 not only academically, but also emotionally, during what can be challenging period of time in the run up to final exams.

Mock feedback is vital in ensuring that students can evaluate their understanding and highlight topics where further revision would be useful, it also allows them to review their time management skills and to understand how approaching exam papers and revision in different ways may work best for them.

Ms Key, Year 11 Year Leader said, "Year 11 students have achieved great success in the February mock exams and over the next two weeks, they will be receiving high quality feedback to pave the way for even further progress towards and beyond their target grade. The Hinckley Academy way involves a three-step feedback process: 'KNOW – HOW – SHOW':

- 1: Students will discover what to KNOW needs improving.
- 2: They will be guided by their teachers on HOW to go about making improvements.
- 3: And finally SHOW in future lessons that they have made further progress."

Each of our students is an individual, with completely unique needs, knowledge and learning style and creating an extensive package of support to help all our students to find success is important. Our broad support package includes extensive MACBETH

opportunities for revision, wellbeing support, mindset coaching and knowledge consolidation to help our young people. Opportunities include, intervention sessions, assemblies, conferences by external speakers, one to one mentoring, drop in sessions and in class feedback. One size doesn't not fit all, and we work hard to identify the best support opportunities to utilise for each individual student.
