#### BOOK GROUP MEET MULTI-AWARD WINNING AUTHOR

This week members of our '10 for 10' book club took part in a virtual author event with multi-award winning children's author Manjeet Mann. The Year 10 book group enjoyed reading Manjeet Mann's book, 'The Crossing', which has now been nominated for the Carnegie Medal 2022. The book covers themes such as the refugee crisis, grief, hate crime and far right groups. Each of the 10 books on the book club's reading list is specially chosen to challenge students through either the content, style or language used and our students have enjoyed reading all the books so far. During the virtual author event, students heard the author read extracts from the book and got to ask her questions about the plot and characters. 

#### Designing and Building Ant Weight Robots

Our Robot Club is an exciting new enrichment opportunity for students in Years 9, 10 and 11. The club, led by Dr Smith and Mr Harrison, supports students to design their own Ant Weight Robot using 3D CAD design software before bringing their creation to life using 3D printing.

After the robots have been built, students will then enter a 'robot wars' style competition alongside other schools within The Futures Trust. The competition is sponsored by Arup, who have kindly donated the equipment to build the robots.

This unique opportunity allows our students to get to grips with 3D CAD design, manufacturing processes, design skills and engineering. Dr Smith would love more students to get involved, and encourages students in Years 9, 10 and 11 to come to D1 on Thursday lunchtimes to find out more. We can't wait to share the final robots and how we get on when they are put to the test later this year!

This is a great opportunity for our students to expand their knowledge and explore a new interest. *More details to be announced shortly.* 


#### MISS KEY'S TOP REVISION TIPS

#### West End Actor Leads Blood Brothers Workshop

On Friday Year 10 and 11 students had the pleasure of taking part in a acting workshop led by professional actor Mike, who studied his craft at LIPA P.A school, before going on to play the role of Sammy in the West End and touring production of Blood Brothers for many years.

Blood Brothers features within the GCSE Drama syllabus, and this unique workshop gave students a fantastic opportunity to not only hear from a professional actor who has played a leading role, but to also get the students to explore the play in a practical space to deepen their understanding ahead of their written exam.

The workshop included a practical warm up, playing a selection of the filmed scenes and a Blood Brothers Q&A. The class were encouraged to consider some of the actors performance choices in specific scenes and make reference to Physicality, Body Language, Energy, Vocal Tone, Pace, Eye Contact and Proxemics and to discuss how their choices help to create tension or humour. After the workshop the school will receive the studio recorded workshop for



classes to continue to use to support their preparation right up until their exam.

It is hoped that this enrichment opportunity will positively impact students ahead of their upcoming exam and help to embed their knowledge of the play. Students thoroughly enjoyed the session, contributing positively and energetically throughout. Mrs Cook, Head of Performing Arts said, "this was such a fantastic opportunity for our GCSE Drama students, bringing Blood Brothers to life with this workshop and giving the students a great understanding of the play for their theory exam. An inspirational day with a west end actor and the students embraced every second – Mike said we have so much acting talent at HAJC6 and I'm so proud of them! Well done!"

The girls continued to show determination and resilience




throughout both games and should be extremely proud of themselves. Well done Year 7!
