Year 8 Reading Champions

All students in Years 7 and 8 are enrolled in the Accelerated Reader programme. This programme is designed to develop students' reading skills quickly by identifying a bespoke ZPD (Zone of Proximal Development) score for each pupil. This 'zone' lies between 'too easy' and 'too hard', and therefore offers students the best chance of progressing in reading.

Once students have finished reading their book, they complete a short quiz online. Students will receive instant feed-



back and also points if they score 80% or above. These points are converted into pride points, certificates, and prizes, and prove an excellent motivational tool. The number of words each student reads is also recorded: we invite your child to set themselves the wonderful goal of becoming one of our 'Word Millionaires' this year and be part of our annual Millionaire celebrations!

For the programme to succeed, students need to read for at least 20 minutes each day. This small injection of daily reading time yields big results as students who participate fully in the programme make at least an additional 3-5 months of progress compared to their non-participating peers.

The Accelerated Reading programme is also available to access from any computer, tablet, or mobile phone. This makes taking quizzes quick and easy: all students need are their login details.



YEAR 9 ARTISTS EXPLORE THE WORKS OF IAN MCARTHUR

Last week Year 9 Art students were inspired by the artist Ian Mac-Arthur and the Mexican Sugar Skulls, investigating how the application of pattern could be refined to contour and represent tone within their chosen imagery.

Students used the success criteria to review their progress after the first lesson, before actively supporting their peers to identify areas for improvement within their outcomes. This was such a lovely working environment to be a part of, with students being constructive in their comments and often demonstrating how progress could be made. I really hope that this continues.





Simple but effective: Revision strategies you can use


- Flash cards
- Retrieval quizzes (make sure you mark them!)
- Mind-map from memory then use your notes to improve in a different colour
- Practice exam questions (from memory, and mark them!)





How to plan your revision easily: The Adapt app.

After completing your daily revision, it will ask you how you feel about the topic and how long it took you. Depending on the response you provide it will prioritise the topics differently.
