Each half term, students will 100% attendance are entered into a £10 voucher prize draw to celebrate their achievement. There are also treat rewards each month for those students who are in every day. The impact on not attending more than 96% of the time is statistically proven to impact on outcomes.

BRIDGE STUDENTS GO CRAZY FOR BADGES!

Mr Stocks in the Bridge had to recruit an army of helpers this week to distribute all of the reward badges students had been awarded before Christmas.

Since returning we have already been able to give out badges to over 200 of our students. This includes Bronze Pride badges for students with over 300 achievement points, Silver Pride badges for student with over 500 achievement points as well as 100% attendance badges, Student Council Badges and Learning mentor badges. This is a clear reflection of the PRIDE our Bridge students show on a daily basis and the clear standards they hold themselves too.



REFLECTING ON THE GATEWAY'S FIRST TERM

Throughout last term Year 8 students worked very hard and there were lots of achievements to celebrate. This includes two teams of Year 8 students who represented the school at the Institute of Engineering and Technology Faraday Challenge Day, in December. The event was hosted in Cafe 6 at the Hinckley School and students competed against four other schools. Teams were given a brief to design and build a prototype which could be developed by the Future Flight Challenge Team for a drone airport. Students were required to demonstrate skills and attitudes such as creativity, planning, budgeting, resilience, and perseverance. Both teams demonstrated PRIDE throughout the day and were a real credit to the school.

In addition to the weekly hot chocolate reward, Year 8 students can cash in their PRIDE points for rewards in the PRIDE shop. The rewards range from chocolate bars for 100 points to body sprays, rugby balls and queue jump passes for 500 points. The PRIDE shop is very popular, and many students are currently saving up for some of the more valuable items.

Over the Autumn term we ran several 100% attendance challenges for students. These challenges are run as both form and individual challenges. In Year 8, 23 students achieved 100% attendance for the entire term and Mr Taylor's form group have continued to be the highest attending group.

Upcoming evets in The Gateway include Smashed Live coming into school in February to deliver a live theatre experience to the students and the second parent forum that will take place virtually through Microsoft Teams on the 15th of March.

STUDENTS EXPLORE HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS IN THEIR PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME THIS WEEK

Our ongoing Personal Development Programme (PDP) takes themes and issues each week during our morning sessions. Students are encouraged to examine and explore these themes through conversation, discussion and debate.

Using our 'Talking Points' is an excellent way in which you can help support the growth in your child's own character development, help to form their own ideas, encourage questions and address misconceptions.

This weeks theme has focused on what a healthy relationship looks like. Students are asked to examine each statement and agree or disagree on them with evidence to back up their viewpoints. Examples of the talking points for you to use at home to continue the conversation and debate are as follows:

Year 7— 'Trust is the most important trait in a friendship.'

Year 8— 'A friend is someone who has your back no matter what.'

Year 9— 'A person who 'likes' your social media posts are a good friend'

Y10/11— 'A healthy relationship is one based on respect and honesty.'

Y12/13—'Love at first sight really exists!'
