PERFORMING ARTS TAKES CENTRE STAGE

Year 12 Drama students made their debut practical examination this week which sparked this season's run of practical exams in Drama. The students showcased their 'reinterpretation' pieces which were a culmination of a published text deconstructed using a practitioner or theatre company of their choice. One group chose the musical 'Into the Woods' and used a Frantic Assembly physical theatre style and another group took a Steven Berkoff approach to the text 'Beautiful Burnout' working with grotesque and stylised physicality, facial expression and exaggerated vocality.

The final performances were professional and worthy of an external audience. Miss Solly, Head of sixth form thoroughly enjoyed being an audience member and commented that the students were 'very good and had made so much progress since the early days'.

Their work stems from a series of workshops exploring a range of practitioners and workshops. A proud Mrs Cook feels this exam sets the tone for the remaining practical assessments and looks forward to Year 11 and 13 performing their work later in March and April.

Students also kindly donated sponsorship money in aid of the Place2Be charity, a charity that supports the mental health of young people. A special mention goes to Rachel in Year 7 who raised a staggering £55!

Money was also raised through a pancake sale. Students very much enjoyed tucking into their American-style pancakes topped with lashings of golden syrup, marshmallows and brightly coloured sprinkles.

Overall, The Hinckley School has raised an incredible **£236** for the Place2Be charity and we thank you all for your support in last week's activities.
